The ICT industry in China has been developing rapidly as a priority in the national economic development, putting in place the world's largest broadband and 4G mobile networks. By June 2018, the optical broadband, 4G subscribers have reached 330 million and 1.1 billion respectively. The in-depth integration between ICTs and traditional industries is accelerating digital transformation in manufacturing, transport, energy, financing and other sectors, and digital economy is becoming increasingly a new driving force for innovative growth, accounting for nearly 33% of GDP as estimated.
